Proposed Pupil Premium Expenditure 2017 - 2018

For the financial year 2017 - 2018, our allocated Pupil Premium funding is **£246,840.**

This funding will be used to narrow the gap between pupil eligible for Pupil Premium and their peers by targeting the potential barriers to learning that these children may experience.

157 pupils qualify for PP funding, accounting for approximately 25% of our pupils. The school has a deprivation indicator of 0.3 (national 0.2), which is in the highest quintile. Although our pupil premium funding is allocated from our free school meal numbers, it is also targeted to close achievement gaps that may be associated with high levels of social deprivation.

- E** Lower levels of engagement within the QFT they are exposed to
- F** Limited exposure to wider opportunities and role models outside of school life
- G** Lack of awareness and understanding of their role as a learner (passive learners, rather than active learners)
